

North Carolina's Voter ID Rules

Voting in Person

North Carolina asks for photo ID to vote in person.

You can use:

Ok if expired up to 1 year (more time after 65th birthday)

- NC driver's license
- NC state ID card
- US passport or passport card
- NC voter issued by county
- NC Student ID approved by NCSBE
- Employee ID approved by NCSBE
- Out-of-state driver's license or ID card
(Only voters who register within 90 days of election)

No expiration date required

- Military ID
- Veterans Health ID card issued by VA
- Tribal enrollment card issued by a tribe recognized by NC state or federal government

Registered voters without a photo ID can still vote by signing an ID exception form.

Voting by Mail

Any North Carolina voter can vote by mail.

Provide one of these numbers when you request an absentee ballot:

- NC driver's license number
- NC state ID card number
- Last 4 digits of your Social Security number

You must also include a copy of accepted photo ID or a completed ID exception form when you return your ballot.

Voter Registration Deadline: October 11

Deadline to Request Mail Ballot: October 29

Statewide Early Voting: Oct. 17 to Nov. 2
(Same-day registration available during early voting!)

Election Day: November 5
